At his residence, in the World's End Passage, Chelsea, Patrick Gibson, at the advanced age of 111. He was born at Magraphan, county of Tipperary, on the 24th of July, 1720. From his great age, and very retentive memory, he was visited by a great many of the nobility. This most extraordinary man has lived for nearly a century without suffering [sic] the slightest bodily ailment. He was pressed into the navy at the age of seventeen, while staying at Waterford; was many years in the situation of purser, and was not superannuated until the 102d year of his age. He was a hale, stout, muscular man, six feet two inches high. He took a great deal of walking exercise, and, until the last year, he walked daily two or three miles.

He retained a perfect recollection of the nine weeks hard frost, which commenced towards the close of 1739, and was a stout boy, attending the plough, when two regiments of soldiers passed him on Longridge Fell, proceeding towards Clitheroe, during the rebellion of 1745. In the 15th year of his age he removed to Manchester, where he was taught to weave on the Dutch loom. He resided under the same roof, and was in the same employ, 71 years, during which period different branches of the family of his employers rose and fell before him, while he stood loved and respected by all.
